

**Sustainability and the Built Environment
Assistant Professor Position**

The College of Design, Construction and Planning at the University of Florida invites applications for a new tenure-track assistant professor position in sustainability with emphasis on conserving, protecting, restoring and enhancing environmental quality for this and future generations. The individual will affiliate with one of the six disciplines found in the College: architecture, building construction, historic preservation, interior design, landscape architecture, and urban and regional planning. An established research or design focus is expected that might include (but is not limited to): green technologies or infrastructure, open space in urban and suburban contexts, sustainable land use practices, sustainable construction, social and cultural dimensions of sustainability, environmental justice and equity, integrated water resource management, and sustainable materials. The successful candidate will be a teacher and scholar who will make a significant contribution to the field of sustainability. This position carries expectations for dissemination of creative professional work and/or research. Teaching responsibilities will include a popular undergraduate course entitled Cities of the World and at least one course in support of the newly created Bachelor of Science in Sustainability and the Built Environment. Special emphasis will be placed on an ability to work in a trans-disciplinary manner with diverse faculty and students.

A terminal degree in the individual's discipline is required. Preferred qualifications include: a doctoral degree, and a demonstrated capacity for teaching, scholarly research, and the ability to attract external funding.

Review of applications will begin February 3, 2009. The search will continue until the position is filled, with a target start date of August 2009. Applicants should send a letter of intent, curriculum vitae, a statement of research goals and teaching goals including specific proposals for courses, a design portfolio and/or projects and publications, and the names, addresses, email addresses and telephone numbers of three references to:
