However, despite their precious nature, often these accumulated materials are not organised—which reduces their potential value and function. This day will explore necessary steps in managing, preserving and providing access to heritage samples so that they can serve as a scholarly resource, and the fundamental ethical principles governing such activities.

- Statement on ethical principles for heritage samples archives
- A review of key steps in developing access policies, and suggested strategies for enhancing access

A primary purpose of heritage samples archives is to support research and education: communicative processes that achieve impact through sharing knowledge. Overcoming data siloes is therefore key to enhancing the function and impact of HSAs. However, for a resource to be useful, it must be known. Hence raising awareness and visibility—both within custodial institutions and beyond—is critical to long-term sustainability. This day will explore a number of themes relating to enhancing the use of HSAs through raising awareness of their existence, and unlocking the data they contain.

- Outline future strategy for heritage samples archives

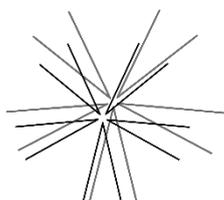
