






BCIN is an essential bibliographic database dedicated to serving the international heritage sector.

HOW BCIN MEMBERSHIP WORKS

As a member library, your catalogue will be uploaded to the database, meaning relevant books, articles and other materials from your collections will be featured in the search results of BCIN users. These items could end up assisting a student in China or a research fellow in the United States; a professor in France or a conservator in Egypt.

Membership also includes:

- Periodic uploads to ensure the catalogue hosted on BCIN stays up-to-date.
- All technical support related to the upload process.
- Recognition as a contributor on the BCIN homepage, including links to your website and online catalogue.

An annual membership fee applies, as well as a one-off charge to cover the cost of the initial upload.
